All other requirements contained within the General Section apply equally to *accommodation* and communal facilities (e.g. emergency management, building and electrical safety).

PROTECTION OF CHILDREN

BASIC

Children living in *accommodation* do not have access to hazardous areas.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR FAMILY LIFE

EXCELLENT


- Family life is promoted by, as a minimum:
 - providing accommodation for families.
 - arranging for education opportunities and after school programmes for workers' children, when not otherwise available.
 - having safe areas for children to play.



COMMUNAL FACILITIES

A 7.14 Accommodation has designated areas for cooking that are clean and in working order. Cooking is only conducted in designated areas. Cooking areas can be replaced by catering or equivalent.

BASIC

A 7.15 Accommodation includes shower and toilet facilities, separated by gender and proportional to the number of *residents*. Shower facilities have hot water.

A D V A N C E D

- A 7.16 Recreational facilities are provided.
- A 7.17 There are suitable facilities for sick *residents* for optimal rest and isolation from others.

Glossary

Accommodation Housing arrangement (on or off-site, long term or not) provided

by the supplier or on behalf of the supplier, consisting of personal living space and communal facilities. Truck cabins are

not regarded as accommodation.

Communal facility Facility provided as part of accommodation that is shared with

other residents. Examples include: shared kitchens, showers and

toilets, laundry areas and recreational areas.

Resident A person who lives in accommodation. Residents include workers

and, in some cases, their families.

Worker A person performing work full-time or part-time. This includes

piece rate workers, vocational trainees and workers undergoing a probationary period, as well as sub-contractor workers working

eighteen (18) hours or more per week on-site.
